Some decisions are easy and some decisions are difficult. "Will I have some ice cream?" is an easy decision, but determining what flavor of ice cream to eat is a difficult decision. Often we want our decisions to be easy, but the reality is that most decisions we make are difficult. Most of the decisions we make are of far greater importance than what flavor of ice cream to put in your cone. (I am shocked that I just thought that, much less put it down on paper!!)

We want our decisions to be absolute. We want decisions that are unequivocally a "Yes" or a "No." In an election year we will get to vote on different offices. The likelihood is that many of us will be voting from a perspective of choosing the candidate who will "do the least damage." Some of us make decisions based on a checklist of "pros" and "cons." Our decisions are often 60% one way or 40% the other. The decisions might not even be that close; 52% one way to 48% the other is more accurate. We want a world where our decisions are mostly 95% to 5%.

Thankfully, I have an opportunity for you that offers an obvious decision that you can make. On Friday, February 17 from 6:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. and Saturday, February 18 from 9:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. the Virginia Baptist Mission Board is sponsoring a church leadership event that will benefit what we do in 2012. Eddie Hammett, a national strategic leadership coach and deacon trainer with the Columbia Partnership, will be in Virginia to lead this event.

This Church Leadership Event will take place in Waynesboro at the First Baptist Church. We won't have to travel far to participate. The cost of the event is \$125 **per church**. The cost is for all of the participants from Belmont. We can bring five participants or we can bring fifty-five participants, and the cost will stay the same. A light supper will be provided on Friday

evening, and a light lunch will be served on Saturday. We will travel to Waynesboro together on the church van. We need to register by Friday, February 10, so they will know how many participants will be coming.

Here is what we will experience. On

Here is what we will experience. Or Friday evening the presentation will center on Eddie Hammett's book, Reaching People Under 40 While Keeping Those Over 60. We will

consider how culture impacts the way that we do church now and in the days ahead. Hammett will offer insight for creating situations that are "Win/Win" for all ages. This session will also examine discipleship strategies that work in our present culture.

Saturday will focus more specifically on deacons. Hammett will look at the deacon's role in growing churches in challenging times. We will examine critical issues that impact a church's ability to grow in faith and membership. Hammett will offer practical solutions deacons can lead that will move a plateaued church into a growing church. Hammett will also offer solutions to breaking growth barriers and provide form and functions that enable deacon ministry to serve their church into growth and missional ministry.

This training event promises to be a great opportunity for Belmont Baptist Church as we continue to discern where God is leading us in 2012 and beyond. This event is not just for deacons. This event is for everyone who is willing to lead and serve as we fulfill God's mission in the Belmont community and through out our world. With these items we were able to help 128 families throughout the year. We also prepared four Thanksgiving baskets this year. As part of our Benevolence fund, we also help families in the Belmont/Carlton area with rent and utilities.

We continue to need donations for the food closet. We need peanut butter, saltines, soup, canned meats, canned fruits, dried beans, cereal, macaroni & cheese, canned vegetables, individual beverages (tea bags, coffee, or hot chocolate), spaghetti sauce and pasta. The food collection is the third Sunday of each month; however, you

may bring your donations to the church office any time.



The Food Closet also benefits from your purchases from Food Lion through the Com-

munity Rewards program. If you have not registered your number, call the church office with the 12-digit number on your Food Lion card, and we will add your name to our list.

Also, if you are in the Crozet area on Wednesdays, have lunch at Sal's Pizza and a percentage of your receipt will be donated to Belmont Baptist Church.
